Jalal was born October 27, 1934 in Ababan, Iran. He attended Razi high school and then the University of Tehran where he earned his Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree in 1961. He started his internship in Iran and applied for his ECFMG (Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates) which assesses the readiness of International medical graduates to enter US residency programs. Jalal was accepted at a hospital in Greensburg, PA and did a one-year rotating internship at West Moreland Hospital in Greensburg.

His Post Graduate Obstetrics & Gynecology work was at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac, which at the time was affiliated with the U of M, from 1961-1962. Jalal was accepted for an OBGYN specialty at St. Joe's from 1962-1965.

Upon his graduation from medical school, he applied to become a US citizen and he dream was fulfilled in 1969. He worked for a bit Downriver, but then settled in the West Bloomfield-Pontiac area to establish his private practice. He was in that practice from 1969 until his retirement in 2012, joining SMCB shortly thereafter.

Jalal was actively involved in teaching residents and other doctors, became an Assistant Clinical Professor at MSU, was



active in seminars and teaching techniques and belonged to multiple medical associations during his lifetime.

Jalal and his wife Rohan were married in 1961, just prior to moving to the US, and reside in Bloomfield Hills. They have 3 daughters and 3 grandchildren.

Jalal joined SMCB in 2012, and over the years, served on the Visitation & Health Committee, was part of the welcome committee and played bridge. He enjoys golf, tennis, social get-togethers and is an avid reader of American history and military books.

SMC FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT


Our second full year of operation was a good one as we kicked off the fundraising campaign to raise \$65,000 to commemorate the Senior Men's Club 65th Anniversary. We haven't reached our goal yet, but we have made great strides as illustrated by the graph included.

With contributions from 82 members and friends of the Club, we have reached 78% of our goal with collections of over \$50,000. Since the inception of the Foundation, we have graciously received over \$90,000 from 134 members and friends.

As a result of the generous donations we recently awarded \$10,000 grants to the Michigan Veterans Home in Chesterfield Township for the "Home Enrichment Program" to support 124 veterans living in the home and to the World War II Legacy Foundation to support the construction of the memorial plaza located at 13 Mile and Woodward in Royal Oak.

Additionally, the Foundation Board of Directors just approved the continuation of a grant award to the Alzheimer's Association of Oakland County of \$10,000 to be presented later this spring. This grant is added to our previous \$5,000 donation awarded in the fall of 2021.

And in order to sustain the Foundation into the future, the Board of Directors has directed an increase in the Foundation Endowment Fund to \$25,000 that will be invested in higher interest bearing accounts.







On Monday, February 13, at 1:00PM, Waller Harris will present, via Zoom, the outstanding crime/thriller, "Fargo" (1996) (1 hour/35 minutes).

In 1987, Jerry Lundegaard (William H Macy) is a car salesman in Minneapolis, who is so deep in debt and desperate for money that he hires two thugs (Steve Buscemi and Peter Stormare) to kidnap his own wife. Jerry's plan is to collect the ransom from his wealthy father-in-law (Harve Presnel), paying the thugs a small portion and keeping the rest to satisfy his debts. Jerry's plans quickly fall apart after the thugs commit a triple homicide, involving a State Trooper and two witnesses, and Police Chief Marge Gunderson (Frances McDormand) is called in to lead the investigation into the killings and ultimately solves the case.

Written, produced and directed by Joel and Ethan Coen, "Fargo" is considered one of the brother's greatest films, receiving seven Oscar nominations and winning two, Best Actress for McDormand and Best Original Screenplay for the Coens. The film was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry and was considered as one of the 100 greatest American Movies by the American Film Institute. In addition, it also scores 94% at Rotten Tomatoes.

So, mark your calendars now and plan to join Waller on February 13, to discover how Marge finally solves the case in this crime classic.

The inperson and Zoom meeting will be held in the basement level of the Baldwin Public Library. Our speaker will be Allen Miller, CPA and tax expert. Allen has spoken to our group in the past and will provide his timely information in the ever-evolving tax world. Having a tax problem can be a good thing with all your gains (or losses) achieved!

As of the Reminder writing deadline, the Stock Game leader is Bill Halbert with an 83% gain in three months. Randy Barnett in second with a 55% gain. George Miller is in third place with a 48% gain. From the publisher's overview: "After the triumphant end of the Napoleonic Wars in 1815, the British took it upon themselves to complete something they had been trying to do since the sixteenth century: find the fabled Northwest Passage. For the next thirty-five years the British Admiralty sent out expedition after expedition to probe the ice-bound waters of the Canadian Arctic in search of a route, and then, after 1845, to find Sir John Franklin, the Royal Navy hero who led the last of these Admiralty expeditions. Enthralling and often harrowing, The Man Who Ate His Boots captures the glory and the folly of this ultimately tragic enterprise."

Excerpted from the publisher's overview: "They were the most famous sisters in China. As the country battled through a hundred years of wars, revolutions and seismic transformations, the three Soong sisters from Shanghai were at the center of power, and each of them left an indelible mark on history.

This is a gripping story of love, war, intrigue, bravery, glamour and betrayal, which takes us on a sweeping journey from Canton to Hawaii to New York, from exiles' quarters in Japan and Berlin to secret meeting rooms in Moscow, and from the compounds of the Communist elite in Beijing to the corridors

of power in democratic Taiwan. In a group biography that is by turns intimate and epic, Jung Chang reveals the lives of three extraordinary women who helped shape twentieth-century China."




