
On Monday, September 12, at 1 pm, Jon Haber will present, via Zoom, the film **Do the Right Thing.** This 1989 film (running time 2 hours) produced, written, and directed by Spike Lee is a hard-hitting drama that deals with violence and racism in a primarily black neighborhood in Brooklyn. Right in the center of this neighborhood is an Italian pizza parlor that is owned by Sal (Danny Aiello). At the beginning of the movie, Sal arrives to work with his two sons Pino (John Turturro) and Vito (Richard Edson). Right from the start, Sal is portrayed as a hard-working, kind, and devoted individual. Just the fact that he owns his own business in rough and tough times shows that he is a smart, efficient, and dedicated man.

Mookie (Spike Lee), an African American, works for Sal delivering pizza and also acts to keep his fellow black folks happy with Sal so they will continue to patronize his restaurant. Sal puts on a happy face and greets all the black people as they shell their hard-earned money out to him for his pizza. But, over time, he has turned into a bigot, hating most black people, and talking behind their back while they are not around. Sal seems to have this father-son bond going on between him and Mookie where Sal is the white father and Mookie the black son who in the end finally rebels.

The story takes a turn for the worse when another character, Buggin Out (Giancarlo Esposito) comes into the restaurant for a slice of pizza and happens to notice that the pizzeria's Wall of Fame exhibits only Italian actors. Buggin' Out believes that a pizzeria in a black neighborhood should showcase black actors, but Sal disagrees. The wall becomes a symbol of racism and hate to Buggin' Out and, ultimately, to other people in the neighborhood, Tensions rise as Buggin Out organizes a boycott against Sal's place and tells his friends to never eat there again.

So, mark your calendars and join us on Monday, September 12. You can then decide if Sal, Mookie or Buggin Out Do the Right Thing.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

To achieve the #1 directive of last year's Strategic Planning Committee, the Communications Committee continues its work towards improving the overall member and guest experience with club communications. The goal is to make communications two-way, timely, interesting, precise, concise, and user-friendly.

To this end, the Communications Committee has:

• Changed the way we use eBlasts:

You may have noticed a change in the number and importance of eBlasts. Too many eBlasts were causing too much work, and much confusion over dates, events and priorities. Committees like Reading and Investment Study are now sending their own email notices to a select group of members who already participate in their activities. Information impacting the entire club membership, such as obituaries, special events, and meetings, continues to be appropriate material for eBlasts. Members who are interested in being on a directed email list from particular committees are invited to contact the committee chairs as noted on the website and in the 2022 Handbook.

• Changed the Friday meetings Reservation System:

Established in fall of 2022 by Gary Melikian, this remains a "work in progress" now under the direction of Robert Sparks. While the system is currently unduly labor intensive, and subject to failings through human error, Robert continues to seek ways to simplify and improve it using our current WIX platform. He is ably assisted in this work by Tom Dahlem.

• Instituted some Graphic Design Changes:

Starting this fall you will notice changes in the club's logo which will be used in all representations of the Senior Men's Club of Birmingham, from electronic and print media to clothing. A new lapel pin is also in the works. The use of a slightly revised logo is the product of the Strategic Planning Committee's intent to make SMCB a "premier organization" among social clubs of similar membership and interests. It is a move towards establishing a unique "brand" identity for SMCB.

• Established a Relationship with Local Press:

Using his extensive public relations and newspaper experience Jack Harned has established a relationship with Birmingham and Bloomfield local press, getting coverage of our monthly activities. His work has given the club much needed local exposure, generating new interest in our work, improved Friday attendance, and increased membership, all resulting in cementing the SMCB "brand".

• Begun a Review of the WIX Platform:

New member Tom Dahlem has taken responsibility as Webmaster and begun an assessment of whether the WIX system remains an appropriate platform for our communications and record keeping. In tandem with Dennis Callan, Tom is responsible for retention of accurate club membership records and electronic communications with members, utilizing WIX and the Microsoft Access program. The duo contributes to the overall improvement of club outreach to the membership.

The work of the Strategic Planning Committee gave club leadership a new direction and priority in focusing on Communications. It will be an ongoing process, knowing that as membership demographics inevitably change, communicating with them must also change.


